with **Laura Waters Hinson**, filmmaker and founder of the Living Bricks reconciliation initiative, and with **Epiphanie Mujawimana**, genocide survivor and founder of ZOE Ministry's Giving Hope Empowerment Project supporting orphans and vulnerable children in Africa.



**Love Offering** at the screening supports two programs reaching out to the Rwandan people:



- **Living Bricks** is the viewer-action campaign started by *As We Forgive* and Prison Fellowship International that aids reconciliation by equipping repentant ex-genocide prisoners with the tools to build housing for victim's families.



- **ZOE Ministry** empowers children orphaned by genocide and HIV/AIDS with comprehensive education in life-skills normally taught by parents. Within 2-3 years in the program, the Giving Hope Empowerment training frees children from lifetime dependency on outside aid.
